PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Beloved Brothers and Sisters,

Grace and peace be multiplied to you in the matchless name of Him Who conquered death, sin and hell, made us 'more than conquerors' and has given us an inheritance among the saints.

About twelve (12) months had elapsed since we sat together in this fashion to discuss Kingdom business as it concerns Living Gospel Missions International. I heartily welcome everyone to this all-important summit.

We began the year with a time of prayer and fasting. Four of us gathered together at the Cornerstone Family Church and sought the face of the Lord for three days. It was a glorious time we had in His presence, and I believe with all my heart that we will soon experience the maximum impact of that special time of prayer.

2ND MISSIONARY JOURNEY TO THE PHILIPPINES

In pursuance of the vision of the ministry, we went to the Philippines in March/April, 2010. The mission was made possible by your contributions, Cornerstone Family Church and another friend and partner who was also part of the team. Two of our ministers from the Port Harcourt, Nigeria, church joined us there. Several Filipino pastors and their churches co-operated and participated in this effort. The crusade was held in the city of San Jose, Nueva-Ecija and the Mayor of the city came and officially declared the meeting open. We had scheduled to have five-day crusade and minister to the pastors for three days. But we only had the crusade for three (3) days and two days of intense pastoral conference. We had about 400 in attendance nightly at the crusade and about a hundred people responded to the altar call. The Lord also confirmed His Word with signs following. Instantaneous healings included arthritis, paralysis, and partial deafness. We had expected more but because it was their election season with series of political campaigns, the attendance was adversely affected, though the natives felt, under the circumstance, that was a great attendance. Usually, during such electioneering campaigns, people don't show up for meetings as they follow different political groups from town to town.

We had a tremendous time with the pastors. There were over 50 pastors and leaders who received ministrations. A lot of them were introduced to the move of the Holy Spirit for the first time. In summary, our time there was very fruitful. We are actually planning another outreach to the Philippines hopefully in 2011 with a different strategy.

INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION

We had our 2nd International biennial Convention in Port Harcourt, Nigeria, August 25th-29th, 2010 which was a huge success. We had a representation of our different Gospel Centers and our main auditorium was filled to over-flow. We also had five people from Cornerstone Family Church, Des Moines, Iowa and Body of Christ Church, Ames, Iowa who graced the convention not only with their sweet presence but with their ministrations and support. They were a blessing to every one of us at the convention. The Theme for the Convention was "Repositioning for Exploits". We reposition spiritually and physically. In Proverbs 23:7, the Bible says, "**As a man thinketh in his heart, so is he.**" The way we think will determine our outcome. We reposition ourselves by the way we think. Without question, our thought life should be controlled by the Word of God. "**Let the word of Christ richly dwell within you**, with all wisdom...." (Col. 3:16) The different ministry gifts blessed and enriched us with their peculiar gifting. The Convention featured morning and evening sessions and a night vigil which began at 10:00pm on Friday, the 27th and ended about 5:00am on Saturday. Several responded to the altar call and there were also a number of healing miracles. There were two incidents at the Convention that are noteworthy. On Saturday night, while we were praying, some ushers carried in a lady who had just slumped, dying. We ministered to her and the Lord revived her. Then, on Sunday, the very last day of the convention, just as the lady whom God brought back to life finished testifying, another girl was carried in, dying. At that point I lost my patience, held this girl who was unconscious and declared, "People don't die here, get up!" She did! What satan tried to use to embarrass the convention, God turned it around to glorify His Great Name. Praise the Name of the Lord!

REPOSITIONING

My vision is to build a mega church. It will require a lot of prayer and hard work. I humbly ask this body to hold up this vision before our Heavenly Father in prayer and support as you have always done. We will also need long buses to convey people to and fro as this service will greatly enhance the fulfillment of the vision. We would also need to acquire a large acreage of land to build a forty thousand-seater auditorium, Office complex, Bible School, Daycare, Primary school etc.

Meanwhile, each Gospel Center has been given the mandate to double its congregation in one year. This is achievable by the principle of 'every one, bring one person to church'. We will greatly emphasize prayer and the Word. It will be wonderful if we, as board members, could start next year with prayer and fasting as we did this year. We have a lot at stake. I believe with all my heart that this is our season of excellence, fulfillment and prosperity. Let us seize the moment.

FUTURE OUTREACH

I have a burden to reach the Native Americans for Christ as no one else has. I have been doing meetings for them for about four or five years under the auspices of a different ministry. The people have accepted me and I think LGMI should take over from here. My vision is to bring a team from Nigeria with our choir and musicians and invade the reservations with the power of the Gospel of Christ.

We are also preparing for LGMI independent meetings from next year beginning in Montana which our beloved sister, Edna is working on. May the Lord prosper us and enable us to carry out His mission faithfully and creditably.
